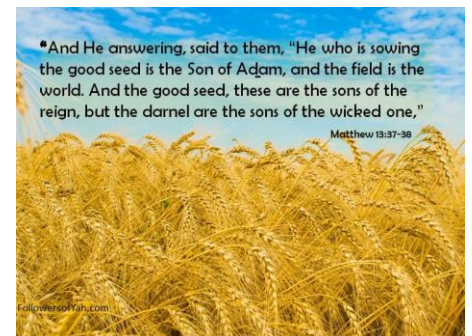
Parable of a Mustard Seed
